

J. Income Limits for Eligibility

Table A contains the income limits for participant eligibility; it reflects 125 percent of the poverty levels established annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Project sponsors cannot enroll anyone into SCSEP whose total countable family income exceeds the limits in this table. (For information on calculating countable income and number of people in a family, see section 204 Computing Income for eligibility.) Table B reflects poverty limits used to determine whether an individual or family is at or below the poverty level for the District of Columbia and all states, except Alaska and Hawaii, as recorded on the SCSEP Participant Form, which is available on the SCSEP portal partners' page of the CWI's website at <http://cwiworks.org>.
